

Different Shades of White

If you want a white to appear warmer, look for yellow undertones. If you want a cooler look go for blue undertones.

Benjamin Moore

- **Decorators White (OC-20)** just a hint of a blue undertone.
- **Paper Mache (AF-25)** Has a slightly green undertone, it would look good paired with tans and blues.
- **Chantilly Lace (OC-65)** Is a cooler white with blue undertones.
- **White Dove (OC-17)** A true white with no yellow undertones. It works well with cool or warm palettes.
- **Cloud White (OC-130)** Has a hint of yellow, with cream-colored undertones. Works well in traditional rooms, kitchens, and baths. It's a warm white.



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Sherwin Williams

- **Extra White (SW 7006)** A true white with no undertones
- **Snowbound (SW 7004)** Cooler grey undertones
- **Eider White (SW 7014)** A subtle and soft neutral with cool undertones
- **Alabaster (SW 7008)** A greige white with a warm undertone
- **Creamy (SW 7012)** A warm white which when paired with other warm pieces, prevents them from looking dull
- **Antique White (SW 6119)** A lot of yellow-beige undertone
